Your Reach Liberal Studies Teaching Pathway

Reach's on-the-job Bachelor of Liberal Studies (BLS) program prepares undergrads to pass Praxis licensure exams and become a classroom-ready teacher. Aspiring teachers who satisfy designated requirements may be eligible to complete their licensure through Reach.

Step 1: Determine Pathway Based Upon College Credits



Designed for learners with 29 or less nonremedial college units/credits.

8 semesters, 4 phases, Two licensure pathways

Licensure via Reach is contingent on satisfying academic & state reqs, including passing the Arkansas Foundations of Reading and Praxis exams.



Designed for transfers with 30 nonremedial college units/credits.

6 semesters, 3 phases

Culminates in a debt-free B.A. with a route to licensure through an ArPEP or alt-cert provider following graduation.



Designed for associate degree holders across the arts and sciences.

4 semesters, 2 years

Culminates in a debt-free B.A. with a route to licensure through an ArPEP or alt-cert provider following graduation.





Step 2: Start Your Reach Journey to a Debt-Free B.A.



Foundational Year

- Blends practical application through job-embedded coursework.
- Coursework: Child development, differentiation in the digital age, and ethical practices in education.
- Develops leadership, critical thinking, literacy, and professional ethics skills.



Advanced Year(s)

- Candidates refine their expertise in science and literacy instruction while preparing for corresponding Praxis exams.
- Coursework: Physical science, biology, and evidencebased literacy instruction through a combination of theoretical study and practical placement experience.
- Integrates critical pedagogy with licensure preparation, ensuring readiness for certification.



Intermediate Year

- Prepares candidates to excel in **Praxis II Subject Area Subtests** and develop effective instructional strategies.
- · Coursework: Historical and mathematical concepts with methods for planning, curriculum design, and reflective practices.
- Equips candidates with the tools to implement best practices in complex educational settings.

Step 3: Take the Steps to Teaching Licensure



Teaching Licensure through Reach's **B.A. in Global Education (BAGE)**

BAGE Licensure Eligibility Requirements

Candidates are required to:

Pass the Arkansas Foundations of Reading exam and 75% of <u>Praxis</u> <u>Content exams</u> by a predetermined date to enter the Clinical Residency.

As of 2025, this is March 1st for fall and October 1st for spring Clinical Year starts.

And:

- Collaborate with the employing school system to secure an approved clinical site serving students in grades K-6 (SPED placements do not qualify at this time).
- Collaborate with employing school system to identify a credentialed Mentor to support Clinical Resident in the clinical setting.
- Spend 18 hours per week, or the equivalent of 3 full days, at the Clinical Residency site in the clinical setting during the first half of the year-long Clinical Residency.
- Spend 24 hours per week, or the equivalent of 4 full days, at the Clinical Residency site in the clinical setting during the second half of the year-long Clinical Residency.
